

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS IN 2024 FOR MAX PLANCK PARTNER GROUPS – OPEN FOR ALL COUNTRIES (EXCLUDING RUSSIA AND BELARUS). A particular focus of this year's call will be on new partner groups in the following regions:

AFRICA, ASIA/SOUTHEAST ASIA and CENTRAL AND EASTERN EUROPEAN COUNTRIES

Nominations for partner groups in these regions are highly encouraged.

DEADLINE: 30 SEPTEMBER 2024

MAX PLANCK PARTNER GROUPS - BRIEF OUTLINE (for further details see nomination documents)

Max Planck Partner Groups are intended for outstanding junior scientists or postdocs who have obtained their doctorate no longer than seven years ago (medicine: nine years). They must have spent a minimum of 6 to 12 months at an MPI before moving to a respective research institution in their home country or one of the regions mentioned above. Partner Groups are supported for up to five years with €20,000 p.a. provided from MPG central funds. Funds can be used to cover expenses for travel, workshops, doctoral students/postdocs and minor equipment.
